2022 PINOT NOIR SEASCAPE VINEYARD

Redwood groves to the east, the pacific ocean to the west, and a small, sunny ridgetop planted to Pinot Noir in between - that is the picturesque Seascape Vineyard. Sitting I,I50 feet above Bodega Bay, Seascape is extremely cold - often ripening in late October - almost always the last vineyard that we will pick. This gem of a vineyard was planted in 1998 next to the well-known Coastlands Vineyard and produces beautiful flavors from this cold edge of winegrowing.

VINTAGE NOTES

The 2022 vintage on the Sonoma Coast was very memorable. After a relatively early bud break, we experienced mild weather through bloom and most of the summer. A lighter than average crop ensured excellent concentration in the wines, and things got very interesting in September. After a prolonged heat wave, we were moving at an incredibly fast pace to bring the fruit in. Once we were able to catch our breath a bit – it rained – because of course it would. After a lull in the pacing – and a nice chance for the rain to knock the dust off the fruit – we resumed harvest at a saner pace and the fruit was brought to the winery in excellent condition. The wines from 2022 show outstanding sense of place and freshness despite the myriad challenges. The logistical puzzle of picking crews, trucks and fermentation space was a wild one, but the wines that are coming out of this wild vintage are well worth it!

WINEMAKING NOTES

Seascape is a beautiful, captivating vineyard — which is helpful while patiently waiting for it to ripen, as it is the last vineyard we pick almost every year. Clone IA is a rare find here, a late ripening clone that pushes some stunning aromatics from the glass. Clone 777 gets ever-so-slightly riper and rounds out the mouthfeel and adds fresh, crunchy fruit. Just a dash of whole cluster (IO%) is used here to heighten earthy aromatics and add a bit more grip through the finish.
